The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is delivered through 362 licenced Award Units, 39 Approved Award Providers, 12 National Organisations and 6 Open Award Centres throughout New Zealand. These Award Units are run by 588 Award Leaders who work voluntarily to oversee participants throughout their entire Award journey. Award Leaders are the face of the Award to participants they train, mentor and guide young people to achieve their Awards.

In the 2021/2022 financial year, 7672 young people registered to undertake the Award. These young people have been supported by both their Award Leader and through Assessors for each discipline who also provide voluntary guidance and mentoring.

The voluntary services provided by Award Leaders and Assessors include:

- Supporting participants to make a positive contribution to their communities
- Mentoring participants to develop new skills in a wide range of areas
- Assisting young people to develop confidence, problem solving skills and resilience to have a promising future in our transforming world

## Additional Information:

The Duke of Edinburgh's Hillary Award is an internationally recognised Award. It is a global non-formal education framework which challenges young people to discover their potential and find their purpose, passion and place in the world.

The Award challenges young people to develop the character, skills and confidence they need to improve themselves and their communities, by encouraging them to step outside their comfort zone and build positive habits that that they will take with them for the rest of their lives.

## **Basis of Preparation**

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Aotearoa New Zealand | Hillary Award (Group) has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future. The financial statements reported are for the group which includes a controlled entity The Duke of Edinburth's Hillary Award New Zealand Foundation. The figures in the performance report are rounded to the nearest dollar.

## Goods and Services Tax (GST)

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

### **Income Tax**

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Aotearoa New Zealand | Hillary Award Group is a registered charitable entity under the Charities Act 2005, and accordingly is exempt from income tax under sections CW41 and CW42 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

## **Bank Accounts and Cash**

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances.

## **Accounts Receivable**

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realisable value after writing off any debts considered uncollectable.

### **Volunteer Services**

There is no recognition of the volunteer contribution to the Award recorded in these statements

## **Term Deposits**

Term Deposit Investments of the Award are recorded at the lower cost or net realisable value

## **Financial Instruments**

The Duke of Edinburgh's Hillary Award New Zealand Foundation investments in Craigs Investment Partners, which contain equities, bonds, and managed funds, are designated as financial assets at fair value through surplus or deficit, as they are classified as held for trading. Financial assets designated as fair value through profit and loss upon initial recognition, are measured at balance date at fair value at the closing price released by the investment manager. This is considered to be a reasonable approximation of fair value.

#### Investment revenue

Interest on term deposits is recognised throughout the term of the investment using the effective interest rate method. Dividend and investment income is recognised on the date that the Foundation receives rights to receive the payments are established. Fair value gains/losses are recognised in the statement of financial performance.

## Tier 2 PBE Accounting Standards Applied

The trust has elected to adopt the standards PBE IPSAS 28 Financial Instruments: Presentation, PBE IPSAS 29 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement, and PBE IPSAS 30 Financial Instruments: Disclosures for its investments in Craigs Investments class of financial assets.

The group has applied PBE IPSAS 35 "Consolidated Financial Statements" and PBE IPSAS 38 "Disclosure of Interest in Other entities".

## Revenue

Grants, fees, sales of goods and services and donations and other revenue are recognised on invoice or receipt, whichever is the earlier. If grants have use of return conditions they are initially recognised as a liability and revenue is recognised as conditions are fulfilled. Interest on term deposits is recognised throughout the term of the investment using the effective interest rate method.

## **Basis of consolidation**

Controlled entities

Controlled entities are entities controlled by the Group, being where the Group has power to govern the financial and operating policies of another entity so as to benefit from that entity's activities.

The operations of controlled entities, namely The Duke of Edinburgh's Hillary Award New Zealand Foundation, have been consolidated into these financial statements from 1 July 2020.

Subsequent changes in a controlled entity that do not result in a loss of control are accounted for within net assets/equity.

Transactions eliminated on consolidation

Intra-group balances and transactions, and unrealised income and expenses arising from intra-group transactions, are eliminated in preparing the consolidated financial statements.

## **Property, Plant and Equipment**

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Economic lives have been established as:

Office Furniture: 5 years
Office Equipment: 3 years
Computer Equipment: 3 years
Computer Software: 3 years
Motor Vehicle: 8 years

All assets are stored at 93 Hutt Park Road, Lower Hutt, New Zealand

Depreciation/Amortisation is calculated on a straight line basis

Intangible assets are measured on initial recognition at cost. They are amortised over their estimated economic useful life and assessed for impairment annually.

## Value in kind Macpac

Value in kind Macpac represents the sum of Macpac vouchers on hand at balance date, and rebates owing for the year. A liability amount represents total vouchers and rebate to be used for Award participants, Award leaders and Award community.

#### **Grant Reserve**

Expenditure incurred during the year is recorded in the statement of financial performance. A transfer is made at year end from reserves to accumulated surpluses to recognise the expense.

IHC - Reserve has been established to fund support for the expansion of the Award programme for young people with intellectual disability.

**Rātā Foundation** - Reserve has been established to support the delivery of the Award programme to a diverse range of rangatahi, particularly those who have barriers to access or need, to access opportunities to realise their potential (through learning, participation in sport and creative activities).

MYD - Reserve has been established to fund the delivery of youth development opportunities involving leadership, mentoring, and volunteering activities that enable young people, aged 12 to 24 years to increase wellbeing and resilience and increase capability.

Tai Shan Foundation - Reserve has been established to fund support to young people based in the Wellington area to grow their potential by participating through the Award programme.

**Foundation North** - Reserve has been established to fund rangatahi to participate in the Award programme, specifically focussed on better outcomes for present and future communities. Priority areas: Children and young people, Tangata Whenua, Pacific Peoples, Communities of Northland and South Auckland, Former refugees, New migrants, Rainbow communities, People living with a disability.

Gallagher Foundation and Gallagher Charitable Trust - Reserve has been established to support the delivery of the Award programme to a diverse range of rangatahi in the Waikato area.

Winton & Margaret Beat Charitable Trust - Reserve has been established to support the delivery of the Award programme to assist young New Zealanders, aged 12 to 24 years, within the Wellington region.

Withiel Fund Charitable Trust - Reserve has been established to support young rangatahi, aged 12 to 24 years, through the residential projects and adventurous journey sections of the Award programme.

**Sports New Zealand** - Reserve has been established to support the Award through the development of their Te Ao journey and rangatahi through active recreation.

Recreation Actearoa - Reserve has been established to support the delivery of the Award via the Outdoor Activity fund, particularly in the Gisborne area.

### Endowment fund reserve

To record the extent of endowment donations received, as endowment donations are to be invested and held by the Foundation to generate income for use by the Foundation (per the Trust Deed Section 3(a)).
